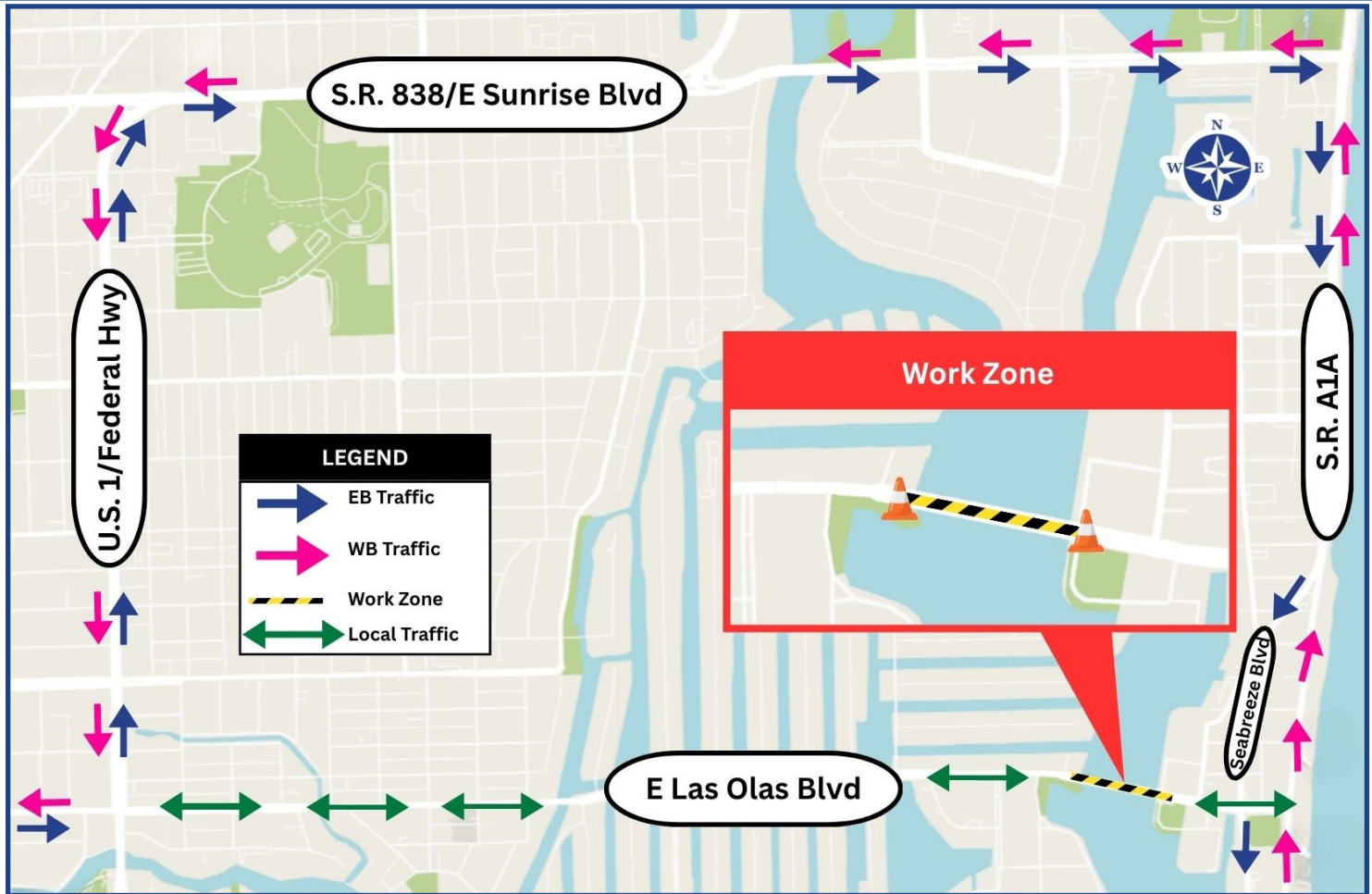
East Las Olas Boulevard Bridge Over the ICWW 48-Hour Full Closure Monday, Aug. 3 through Wednesday, Aug. 5, 2026

The East Las Olas Boulevard Bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway will be closed to through traffic for 48 hours, beginning Monday, Aug. 3, at 8 p.m. through Wednesday, Aug. 5, at 8 p.m. This closure is necessary to safely implement a traffic shift and transition the bridge to a temporary control system. Activities will include median modifications, installation of temporary traffic barriers and pavement markings, bridge control system modifications, and operational testing. Eastbound traffic will be detoured via U.S. 1/Federal Highway, S.R. 838/East Sunrise Boulevard, and S.R. A1A. Westbound traffic will be detoured via S.R. A1A, S.R. 838/East Sunrise Boulevard, and U.S. 1/Federal Highway. Access to local traffic, residents, businesses, and emergency services will be maintained on both sides of the bridge; however, no traffic will be permitted to cross the bridge during the closure. Detour signage will be in place to assist motorists. An alternative route is the 17th Street Causeway Bridge. Pedestrians will be detoured during the 48-hour closure, and there are no maritime impacts to the channel.
